





In 1989, Batman came back to the big screen — the first time in 23 years. Warner Brothers hired Tim Burton and Anton Furst, the production designer for Gotham City and the Batmobile. This car was created from two Impala chassis and had a Chevy V8.

Designed by Bruce Timm, this Batmobile matched the simpler styles of The New Adventures of Batman & Robin.







<mark>2005</mark> Batman/Danger Girl





Designed by Christopher Nolan and Nathan Crowley, this Batmobile was intended to look as real as possible. It was 9-feet wide and 15-feet long, but it could still reach 0-60

mph in less than 6 seconds. It had a 500-HP Chevy 350 V8 and four 44" Super Swamper tires on Titanium axles. Normally

the driver sits on the left, but in attack mode, the driver is moved to the center and is positioned to be face-down between the two wheels. This position offers greater protection to the driver, it also reduces any chance of injury.






THE RESURRECTION OF RA'S AL GHUL











Designed by Rocksteady Studios Batman: Arkham Asylum was released August 25, 2009 for the PlayStation 3, Xbox 360, and PC. Written by Paul Dini, it features several veteran Batman actors reprising their voice roles. Like many other designs from the past two decades, it draws inspiration from the 1989 Batmobile including the louvered rear panel, cowled exhaust port, rear inlets, and side details.
